Culture: The projects deal with European culture and history as well as Europe's past and present examined from various perspectives with emphasis on collective identities and the way they contribute to the perception of European history and present. The aim of our team is to examine the complicated influence of common religious, ethnic, national, social, legal and economic roots dating back to antiquity and their impact on a shared and constantly evolving European identity.

Plurality: The projects concern the plurality of European cultural roots. They regard cultural regions of Europe, like Central Europe, or cultural communities. like the francophone community as well as religious and political ones. We want to underline the plurality of the cultural groups which compose a strong unified European community.

Communication: The projects address various linguistic matters concerning communication, teacher training, adaptation of curricula, translation, and linguistic plurality, which are particularly challenging in a multilingual Europe. They aim at an in-depth analysis of the present situation working towards satisfactory solutions based on close cooperation and promotion of excellent practices.

Challenges: While undergoing rapid political, social, economic, environmental and institutional changes (e.g. European Union project, migrations, Foreign Direct Investment, responses to international old and new powers and partners, effects of globalization and localization, etc.) Europe meets numerous challenges as it needs to adapt to new situations and sustain its unique integrity and common values. The projects address various challenges awaiting Europe today and in the future.
