The purpose of the seminar is to discuss student and staff mobility in different contexts and from different angles.

It is hardly possible, nowadays, to imagine a university development strategy without a robust student & staff mobility plan, especially in the European countries benefiting for decades from the EU mobility programmes. They cannot, however, be the stand-alone measures to support student & staff mobility at the universities in a long term. Therefore, the institutional and national mobility support measures come into play to create a synergy effect and make most of all funding at hand. The outgoing and the incoming student & staff mobility programme, if used wisely, can greatly contribute to the internationalisation and capacity building of a research university and thus cannot be easily, if at all, substituted by other measures. It seems, there is a common understanding, at the EU and national level, of the significance of supporting institutional student and staff mobility on the way to development and strengthening the European Universities of the Future. They are cooperating very intensively, in unprecedented (Covid-19 pandemic) conditions, pooling all available resources and organisational capacities to reach the new demanding European Universities Programme targets, especially for student mobility, making the virtual and blended mobility the prevailing modes of the brain circulation in the ERA and the EHEA. Would it become a new *modus operandi* of the European universities in the future with no way back to the pre-pandemic “order”?
